**REGULATORY CONDITIONS**

The proposed activities include the following: removal of the existing earth dam embankment and the concrete spillway in four stages over a period of four years. The activities will impact 8,276.4 square feet of watercourse associated with Iffland Pond and an unnamed tributary stream to the Naugatuck River.



#### PETITIONS FOR HEARING

Petitions for a hearing shall be submitted within thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this public notice and should include the application number noted above and also identify a contact person to receive notifications. Petitions may also identify a person who is authorized to engage in discussions regarding the application and, if resolution is reached, withdraw the petition. In order to facilitate the filing of requests for hearing during the COVID-19 emergency and be consistent with the Department's Temporary Directive, the Office of Adjudications will accept electronically-filed petitions in addition to petitions submitted by mail. Petitions with required signatures may be filed by email to the Office of Adjudications at [deep.adjudications@ct.gov](mailto:deep.adjudications@ct.gov) or mailed to the DEEP Office of Adjudications, 79 Elm Street, Hartford, CT 06106.
