## **REGULATORY CONDITIONS**

The proposed activities include the following: replace the existing spillway masonry spillway training walls with concrete training walls, replace the existing low-level outlet works, repair the existing concrete portion of the dam and spillway, install rip-rap revetment on the upstream face of the dam, re-grade the low spot to the west of the dam to match the dam crest elevation, raise

the adjacent earthen dike to above the dam crest elevation, and remove trees and stump on and within 25 feet of the dam and dike embankments.

The proposed activities will impact 5,800 square feet of wetlands and 4,600 square feet of watercourse associated with the Nystrom Pond and Turner Brook.

## PETITIONS FOR HEARING

Petitions may also identify a person who is authorized to engage in discussions regarding the application and, if resolution is reached, withdraw the petition. In order to facilitate the filing of requests for hearing during the COVID-19 emergency and be consistent with the Department's Temporary Directive, the Office of Adjudications will accept electronically-filed petitions in addition to petitions submitted by mail.
